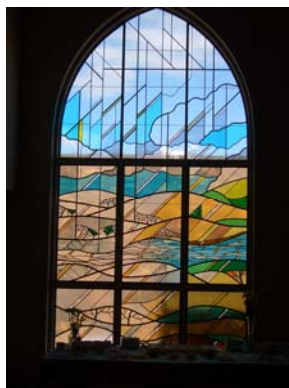
## Thoughts after a Session Meeting... Focus on communications

**PW Monthly Assignment List...**

There has been some confusion about the purpose of the monthly assignment list. Fellowship is now being done on a sign-up basis. The lead people for each month are encouraged to pass the sign-up book around for fellowship hosts. The monthly assignment list is a guideline for serving funerals. In the event of a need for a funeral lunch, the lead person for the month plans the lunch, calls the people on the list for workers and for food donations. This list will also be used by the shepherds when there is a need for meals for church members who are ill or recovering from surgery.

## Pastor's Perspective

### Pastor's Response

#### **There seem to be some strong feelings surfacing about music in our church these days. What's going on?**

A lot of us don't see eye-to-eye on church music. In many disagreements in a church, people focus on staff members and see them as battling, rather than take responsibility as a board (session, in our case) and a congregation for honest dialogue about hopes and dreams for the future of their church. Some of that conversation is taking place in the worship team and in transformers meetings. The session is already helping and will be moving to take more responsibility. It is important for everyone to understand that there are very diverse opinions about church music throughout our congregation. Some strongly favor traditional hymns and classical music. Others strongly favor what is called contemporary church music. And, I daresay, the majority appreciate having both, during worship services. That is normally called a blended service – where the traditional is honored and the contemporary is welcomed. Then there is music for a youth service (see below). I think we need to find ways for joyful expression of all kinds of music.

Paul Kosower, our music minister, and I, are meeting this week to begin anew in working for better communication and seeking some harmony in this matter so that we can have a hand in leading our congregation into a healthy future.

#### **I heard our youth had a special worship service. What's that all about?**

Yes, there was a special worship service for youth on Wednesday, Oct 24. It was planned by our youth and Ali Knoll, our youth leader. Some other youth helped and many youth from the community attended. Several adults from our church were there, too.

There was a band with Alex Beighley playing guitar and Jeremy Facklam, the drums. Among the singers were Erika Cooley, Jenna Facklam, Olivia Linden, Jaime Ostrom, John Lynch and Ali. There were prayers and Ali brought a message.

The service was built around a theme of music. They

showed a video in which a pastor talked about God as composer of the music of our hearts and of the universe. He said we could choose to be in or out of tune with God. Ali spoke about music as well and it all came together as a challenge to follow and obey God – to be in tune with God.

They made great use of our new laptop computer and video projector with slides and song lyrics projected upon a screen. It was an effective preview of how useful our new video projection system will be when installed.

Church adults in attendance there spoke well of the service, and the experience, and join in inviting you to attend a service in the future – the fourth Wednesday of each month.

#### **We just voted to increase the session size from 9 to 12 members. Is that really necessary?**

It should help in the operation of our church. We are looking to draw into the session (our church board) more of the vital functions of our church.

For years, the session has been built around the concept of providing support for the various ministries and groups in our church. To this end, the session has had only four teams – property, personnel, finance, and planning/mission. Each team has two elders and sometimes additional members from the congregation. Worship, music, education, and youth ministries, for example, have only reported to the session occasionally. And so, session members have not been asked to responsible and accountable for the primary work of the church.

Now, with additional members, the session will reorganize to bring more oversight and leadership to our several programs. We also want to be ready for our consultant's visit in March. Early thoughts are to have a new communications team to address communication needs as we move through a transformation process in coming years. The session is also discussing adding a worship and music team that will offer direction and support for our worship leaders group and our music ministry. Exactly how these will function will be considered at a session retreat on December 1. Other teams may be shifted or redefined, as well.
