Pastor's Perspective

Getting Going!

Beginning now and continuing for several months, I will be encouraging and coaching for adult spiritual growth. Right now I am working through appointments with session and staff members; introducing or reinforcing adult spiritual formation. In fact, this will become a principle focus of my work. Each worshiper and member will be challenged during this time, too.

In church transformation, there are two engines that power change. One is individual spiritual growth; the other is building a foundation of trust through developing a clear identity. In our new language here, that is building the DNA of our church: the core values, bedrock beliefs, the vision and the mission. They both have to be started up. My job will be to start and train for spiritual growth. Your job will be to get clear about who we are; what is our mission; what are the values and beliefs that we share; and build an identity that will be encouraging and inviting to others.

We will go deeper with Jesus (spiritual growth) so that we can join Jesus in mission (identity, vision, sense of purpose).

We will begin to work on our foundation of trust, our DNA, on Saturday, April 5. St. Joseph's Hospital has made a large room available to us. And they will provide morning and afternoon snacks for us, without charge. Lunch will be in the cafeteria or you may bring your own. We are going to meet there from 8:30 to 4:00.

Here's what we are going to do:

- Pray, search the Bible, share our concerns for our church and then, pray some more
- Learn some skills for personal spiritual growth
- Learn how we will go about discovering

and clarifying our values and beliefs; and actually begin the all-important work while we are there. Much of this will take place as we gather in table-sized groups. We will end with "top ten" lists of each.

- Learn how a vision comes about; how we will get to a mission
- Talk about what we will be doing in the months ahead to define and refine what We develop on Saturday

Some have asked if they can come for a part of the time on Saturday. The answer is "Yes." While you will miss a sense of having a strong hand in what is being built, your presence and indication of interest will be important to all who are there. And, you will get a sense of how important what we are doing is. We will be in small groups part of the time and you can connect even more deeply by sitting in on one of them.

This will be one of the most important large-group gatherings we have this year. On Saturday, we will be building energy and hope for our process of transformation – moving from a declining church to a thriving church. The good news is that many of us want that to happen.

Notes from around the church.....

Finance Team...

The Finance Team is looking ahead to 2009. The Session approved a plan to shift mortgage payments into the Operating Mission Fund (OMF) starting in 2009.

- Based on the planned giving to the 2008 Mortgage Retirement Fund (MRF) the mortgage balance at the end of 2008 should be \$485,300.
- We expect our monthly payments in 2009 to be \$3,500 per month or \$42,000 for the entire year.
- The \$42,000 annual mortgage cost will be an increase to the 2009 budget that is supported by the Operating Mission Fund.
- Based on 2008 estimate of giving to the MRF it will take 22% of the current Mortgage Retirement giving to cover the increase to the 2009 OMF.

The Mortgage Retirement Fund has in the past paid both the mortgage and reduced the principal. The MRF will continue to accept gifts that will be used to reduce the mortgage principal while the OMF will make the monthly mortgage payments.

Staff News....

Our custodian, Joe Gunn, has resigned. We have hired Jeff Teubert, who began March 31. Joe has driven from New Auburn each day – gas prices are rising and he is a single parent taking care of two wonderful little girls. Working in Chippewa Falls has become more of a burden than a joy. We are sorry to see him go. He has done much good work for us.

Jeff lives on the west hill, within walking distance of the church. He has a lot of skills related to building and property care. He is pleased to be in a welcoming and Christian community.

And on another note, Paul Kosower will be taking vacation from April 1-8. He and Jan will travel to Arizona to visit his brother's family.

FYI: Your church staff is meeting each Friday morning for an hour of devotions, planning, reporting and personal sharing.

Library News...

Dear Readers - No new books to tell you about this month. I haven't read anything from our library since I read the Tom Bandy books. However, Esther Frazier told me about a series she is reading and really enjoying and I leaned on her to review them. She was kind enough to do so -- and she writes a mighty fine review.

Trilogy of Stonewycke by Michael Phillips and Judith Pella.

Book 1 - The Heather Hills of Stonewycke. Stonewycke was the ancestral home of Atlanta Ramsey Duncan. She lived there with her husband, James Duncan, daughter Margaret "Maggie" and James' illegitimate son. James was determined that Maggie would marry the son of his friend, Falkirk, in order to finance his projects. The son was killed and Ian was accused. Ian and Maggie left Stonewycke and were married, planning to leave Scotland and go to America. Because of the charges against him, Ian sent Maggie ahead to New York. He was later arrested and thrown in prison.

Book 2 - Flight from Stonewycke. Maggie arrived in New York and stayed with Drew and Ellie Mackinaw. Maggie received a letter from her mother telling her erroneously of Ian's death. She decided to join the wagon train west and along the trail gave birth to a daughter, Eleanor. Dermott, a lawyer, had contact with Ian and was trying to clear his name.

Book 3 - The Lady of Stonewycke. Maggie and Ian were reunited and regained their birthright to Stonewycke.
